OKMQA Minutes of January 27, 2024

Meeting Location: Beth's Quilting Quarters, 114 N. Main, Blanchard, OK

- 1. Meeting was called to order by President, Sandy Gard.
- 2. We welcomed several visitors to the group and everyone introduced themselves and shared a little about the machines they are using (longarm & domestic). Carol Koster brought a selection of books, patterns, etc. to donate to group members from Al's library.
- 3. Minutes from the October 28, 2023 meeting were presented to members for review/comment.

Colleen Billen moved to approve the minutes as written, Nancy Griffin seconded, and the motion was approved by member vote.

4. No Treasury report was available, as Leah Alspaugh (Treasurer) has some ongoing personal health issues. Due to this, Leah requested an alternate be installed to take over responsibilities until the end of the year. After discussion/agreement, Sandy Gard (President) appointed Kerry Fisbeck who will handle Treasurer responsibilities until Leah's return. Colleen Billen is still listed as a signatory on the account and will be able to sign checks as needed in the interim.

5. Committee reports:

a. Positive Tomorrow Quilt Project: Joyce Curtis provided background on how the project started and can always use additional machine quilters if anyone wants to volunteer. Volunteers receive three (3) tops, batting, backing, and binding. Volunteers have the option to complete the binding or return and others will complete.

The pattern being used is posted on

https://www.okmqa.org website and our Facebook pages. Members can make their own quilts or any other alternative is welcome. Joyce recently delivered an additional 75 quilts for distribution but retains a backlog of tops for those who have time and can help. This is a wonderful way to

practice your quilting and to help others!

- b. Programs: Colleen Billen has scheduled Jan Hutchinson for the July 20, 2024 meeting. Jan is a well-known and highly awarded machine quilter who will speak (45 min-1 hr) and then do a trunk show. Reservations will be required for both Guild members and guests to track attendance (maximum # for Beth's space is approx. 80). Non-guild members will be charged \$10 or can join our Guild (\$25/year). Since Beth's space only has 40 chairs, several guild members indicated they would be able to bring extra folding chairs. Budget for the program has been set at \$800, but costs will be offset with non-member attendees. Registration details will be finalized and available at the April 2024 meeting.

- d. Facebook/OKMQA Website: OKMQA maintains two (2) separate Facebook pages: 1) OKMQA-Members Only; and 2) Oklahoma Machine Quilters Association that is open to the public. Annette Bean serves as administrator for the public Facebook page and agreed to follow-up with Diane Cerny regarding also managing the "members only" site. A link to the OKMQA website can be found in the "About" section on the public Facebook page, but members recommended adding a link to the "members only" page. It was also suggested that our quarterly meeting dates be posted on both pages to provide increased visibility.
- e. Membership: Annette Bean reported that we had 34 members as of today, with 9 of those who have not yet renewed for 2024. Annette plans to remind those individuals and let them know about the special guest scheduled for our July meeting to encourage renewal.

- a. Same But Different Quilt Project: Audrey Gramling selected several patterns and members were invited to vote on the pattern of their choice (via Facebook: OKMQA-Members only).

Audrey presented a copy of the winning pattern ("Slipknot") along with fabric requirements and instructions. Members present voted on one of two fabric choice options and those interested purchased fabric from Beth's. Members are reminded the goal is to complete your project (don't forget a sleeve!) and return it to the April 2024 meeting. The "same but different" quilts are displayed at quilt shows/events around the state to highlight the difference quilting can make when all else remains the same (i.e., pattern, fabric, colors, etc.)






































